# Deliberating to inform decision-making

Decision-making in the public health sector is complex. There are often uncertainties regarding the effectiveness of projects, programs, and policies to solve public health problems. In addition, there is often no consensus among the population, or among experts and decision-makers, about the best course of action. Deliberative processes can support decision-making by creating a dialogue between the various stakeholders to critically examine an issue and come to a rationally motivated agreement. The objective of this one-day workshop is to inform public health professionals and decision-makers in the use of deliberative processes to inform decision-making
